NEIGHBOR 2 NEIGHBOR: The Pool is Open!

We would like to apologize for the 2-week delay in opening the pool this year. The extreme conditions of this past winter resulted in several cracks in the tile, pool surface, and deck that needed to be repaired. Since this was something that occurred over the winter while the pool was covered, we were not able to plan the repairs in advance and

were therefore at the mercy of the pool contractors' busy spring schedule.

The pool is open now according to its regular seasonal schedule: weather permitting, weekends only until schools let out on June 20th. From June 21st through Labor Day Weekend, the pool will be open daily from 10am until 8pm, according to weather and We will update everylifeguard availability.

Lifequards will hang an "Open" flag in plain view whenever the pool is open, so just glance out your window or give the Leasing Office a call if you're not sure.

As part of the Phase III construction, we have added a parking area for the pool. should be open and accessible by mid-July.

Stephany: "My favorite hobbies are kayaking, oil painting and photography."


Lester: "I'm willing to sing and dance at the drop of a dime."


